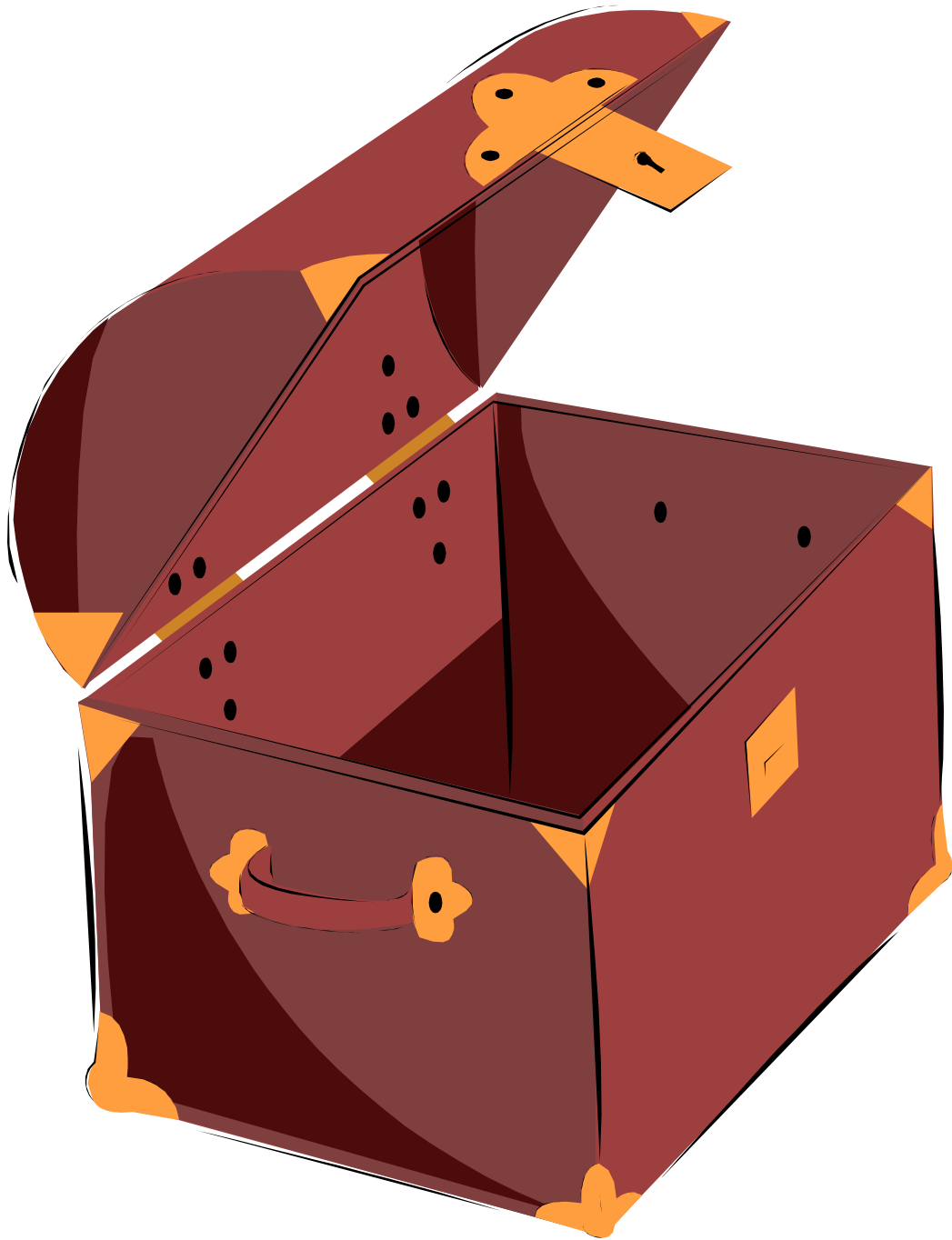


## Mining Camp Money
